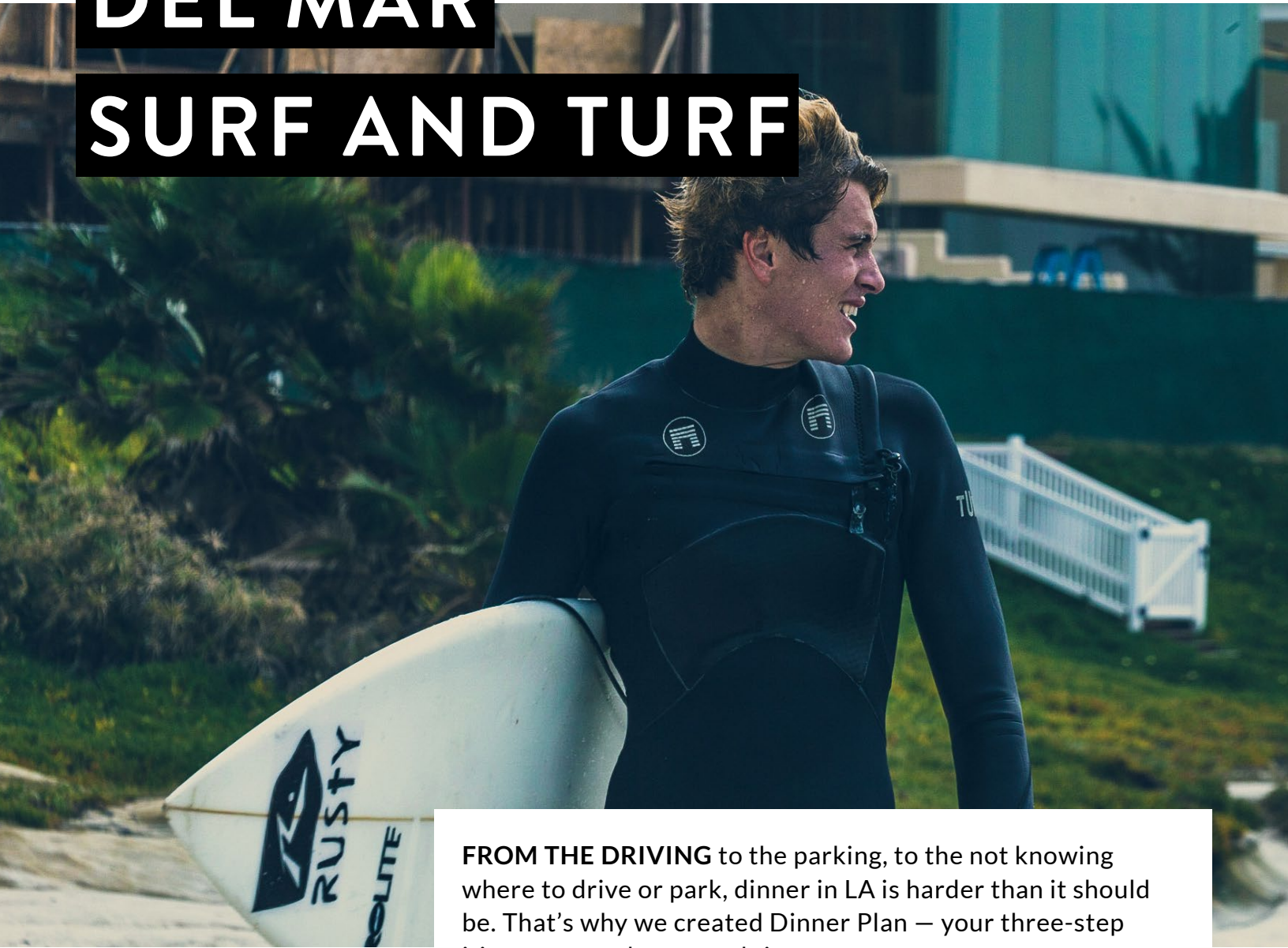

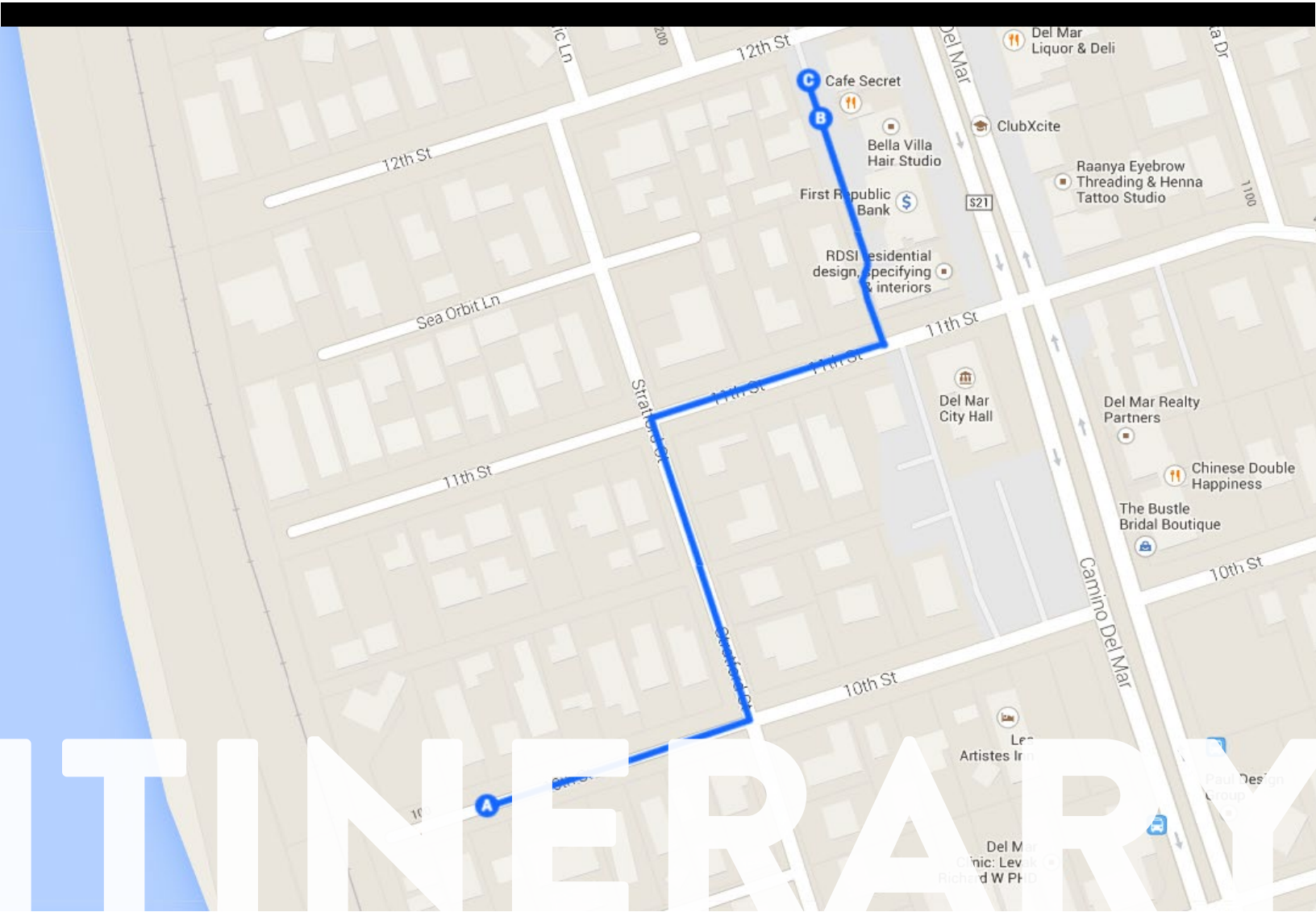

**LATE LUNCH**
